The UBC<br>vehicle was driving north and the other vehicle was<br>entering the highway seeking to cross the lane<br>being traveled in by the UBC vehicle to turn left<br>and drive south on the highway. The driver of the<br>UBC vehicle saw that the incoming vehicle had<br>stopped as per the right of way, but then the other<br>vehicle suddenly accelerated across the intersection<br>causing the driver of the UBC vehicle to take<br>evasive action. The asphalt was wet from earlier<br>rain, impacting the maneuverability of the vehicles.<br>The UBC vehicle slid when the brakes were applied<br>and the other vehicle was struck perpendicularly on<br>the driver door side. The UBC personnel did not<br>receive any injuries but the UBC vehicle received<br>minor damage and the airbags did not deploy. The<br>UBC driver immediately checked on the other<br>driver, the other driver did not display any physical<br>injuries but they were confused and in a bit of<br>shock, and their car was damaged from the impact<br>(and the airbags had deployed).
