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INSPECTION NOTES

I conducted an inspection of this workplace with occupational safety officer Derek Faulkner on November 12, 2024. This report has been issued as a result of this employer requesting information on emergency washing facilities.

The following information was discussed:

Emergency washing facilities

In a building off campus, Innovation Precinct 1, the employer is currently planning on installing a new laboratory module that would allow workers to interact safely with lithium. The pre-fabricated lithium module would have a fume hood for workers to utilize. The lithium module would be separated from the remainder of the laboratory with a vestibule that has two (2) crash doors that swing outwards from the lithium module. Due to the reactivity of lithium to moisture, the lithium module is required to be completely water free.

The employer has done a risk assessment in accordance with *Table 5-2* and determined their risk level, for the purposes of providing adequate emergency washing facilities, to be high risk. Furthermore, by *Table 5-3*, the employer has also determined that they are required to have "continuous flow wash facilities... no more than 6 meters of the hazard area". The employer provided a copy of their current plans for the location of the emergency washing facilities. Due to the reactivity of lithium to moisture, the current plan calls for the emergency washing facilities to be located on the laboratory side of the double crash doors, in excess of 6 meters of the hazard area.

The Occupational Health and Safety Regulation (OHS Regulation) contains legal requirements that must be met at all workplaces under the inspectional jurisdiction of WorkSafeBC. However, it may not always be possible for an employer to comply with a particular regulatory requirement in certain workplaces or while conducting certain work processes. In such cases, we may issue a variance or an acceptance. The employer has been invited to explore the variance and acceptance process with WorkSafeBC as it relates to the location of their emergency washing facilities. A link to the process has been provided in the Resources section below.
